Class Format:	Lectures, Case Analysis/Presentations, Papers, and Projects	
Class Attendance:	Class attendance is mandatory until the last day of classes	
Class Participation:	Class participation is part of the student's final grade in most courses	
Course Grading:	4.3 grading scale, letter graded, with grade D as marginal pass; final course grade often based on class participation, projects, case analysis, mid-term and final exams. Some courses are graded on a curve.	
Class Size:	Normally 30 – 40 students per a class for 2000 - 4000 level courses	
Course Load:	A maximum total of 5 courses within 17 credits in total.	
Course Choices:	Exchange students can select as long as they meet the prerequisite requirements and subject to space availabilities. Some courses may require professor approval for enrollment.	

Examinations: Transcripts:	Format of exams varies. Final exams are written in the last 2 weeks of the school. Students are responsible to stay in HK until the last day of finals. Requests for early leave of exams are normally not considered. Students receive 2 free transcript copies. All transcripts are mailed to	
	students' home universities for handling and will take about 6-8 weeks after the semester for the arrival.
